SEATTLE – More than half of Washington State Ferries’ 22-vessel fleet is scheduled to retire by 2040. Five of these ferries are more than 50 years old and need to be replaced immediately to sustain reliable service. These findings are among the key themes of WSF’s newly released draft Long Range Plan, which will be available for public review and comment starting Sept. 10.

“The ferry system is a critical part of our state’s transportation network and reliability is our customers’ top concern,” said WSF Assistant Secretary Amy Scarton. “This plan makes it clear that we need to invest immediately in building new ferries, improving the customer experience and greening the fleet through 2040 and beyond.”

The [draft Long Range Plan](#) builds upon WSF’s [2009 Long Range Plan](#) as directed by the Washington State Legislature. The plan addresses four major themes:

- Reliable service
- Customer experience
- Managing growth
- Sustainability and resilience

The draft reflects extensive input from the public and stakeholders, including nearly 1,400 comments and survey responses submitted during spring 2018 outreach sessions.

How to comment

Through Oct. 25, WSF invites the public to review and comment on the draft Long Range Plan.

People can view materials and submit comments via an [online open house](#), which will run from Sept. 10 to Oct. 25. WSF is also hosting 11 open houses in ferry-served communities featuring display boards that explain the planning process and highlight key plan findings and

recommendations. Staff will be available to answer questions, and people will be encouraged to provide written comments or verbal comments to a court reporter. Drop by anytime during any of the open houses; there will not be a formal presentation.

Port Townsend's open houses on the Washington State Ferries' draft long-range plan drew divided opinions on what size ferries should be, with both sides agreeing the Keyshore Harbor on Whidbey Island needs to be addressed.

Jash Peters of Chincam spoke with Ray Deardorf, senior planning manager for Washington State Ferries, at the Cotton Building Oct. 10, and came away mostly pleased by what he heard.

"It seems like they're heading in the right direction," Deardorf said, expressing his approval for the WSF's planned plans to retire existing vessels while building their replacements. "It seems like they're aggressively encouraging more pedestrian than vehicle use. I'm not sure how that'll pan out, but it's good

Washington State Ferries is floating a proposal to commission 16 new ferries, grow its fleet by four boats, shift vessels to hybrid-electric power and make improvements to ferry terminals as part of \$7.6 billion of capital projects around Puget Sound over the next two decades.

In a draft of its long-range plan released this week, WSF said the lion's share of that funding (\$5.5 billion) would be dedicated to new vessel construction and preservation of existing vessels. Work on ferry terminals over that period account for about \$1.8 billion.

The plan identifies \$6.7 billion of projected capital and operating costs that don't have funding yet. Historically that shortfall has been covered through appropriations made by the Legislature, the report said.


