

Contractor Reporting Requirements for Hazardous Materials Events

Hazardous Materials Event

Spills contained to impervious surfaces (e.g. asphalt) generally don't need to be reported to outside agencies.

If **unplanned contamination** is discovered, report to the WSDOT Project Engineer, who follows ECAP.

If a **new release** occurs into, within, or from the Project boundaries, report to the WSDOT Project Engineer & regulatory agencies indicated below.

If an **Underground Storage Tank (UST)** is discovered, report to the WSDOT Project Engineer who requests a site assessment from ESO HazMat.

Water

Including ponds, wetlands, ditches, and seasonally dry streams.

Immediately call **all three** 24-hour numbers

- 1) National Response Center 1-800-424-8802
- 2) Washington State Division of Emergency Management 1-800-258-5990 or 1-800-OILS-911
- 3) The regional Ecology office listed below.

Soil

Including discovery of unplanned contamination.

If the material could reach a water body or shallow groundwater, is flammable, or emits toxic vapors, **immediately** call the regional Ecology office listed below.

Otherwise, report to the regional Ecology office below within 90 days.

Air

Such as fugitive dust, smoke, and toxic vapors.

If material is released to air, report the WSDOT Project Engineer.

Underground Storage Tank (UST)

If a release from a regulated UST is confirmed report to both:

- 1) The regional Ecology office listed below within 24 hours.
- 2) The WSDOT Project Engineer who requests a site assessment from ESO HazMat.
