



Vashon terminal: Noisy daytime construction Aug. 20 – Feb. 2016

Trestle rehabilitation work

The Vashon ferry terminal provides a critical link between Vashon Island, the Seattle mainland and the communities west of Puget Sound. The existing Vashon ferry dock was constructed in 1957 and is vulnerable to earthquakes.

The Vashon Ferry Trestle Rehabilitation project will bring the entire ferry dock up to current seismic code and allow access to and from the island in the event of an earthquake.

Noisy work

Work to remove a series of decaying timber support piles begins Aug. 20. The piles will be removed by vibrating them out of the ground. Once the timber is removed, crews will work from a barge to drive steel support piles into the ground. Steel pile driving work starts in early Sept. and lasts until Feb. 15, 2016.

- Construction will begin on the west side of the dock first, and then move to the east side.

Work hours

Crews will work from 30 minutes after sunrise to up to one hour before sunset. Days and hours will vary throughout the year.

Traffic safety during construction

Flaggers positioned at the entrance of the terminal are in place to assist with:

- Directing vehicles, motorcycles, bicycles and pedestrians on and off the dock.
- ADA Drop-off and pick-up at the ferry.
- Vanpool access.



Pedestrians and motorists: please use caution and follow all posted signs and speed limits.

Bicycles, motorcycles, and ALL Southworth traffic, use 103rd

In addition to all Southworth-bound traffic, bicycles and motorcycles heading to Fautleroy or Southworth must access the ferry via 103rd. It is unsafe to bypass the queue of waiting vehicles by driving against traffic on Vashon Highway.
