Crews begin construction of noise wall on west side of I-5

Starting this week, construction crews working for WSDOT will [take the first steps](#) toward building [three new noise walls](#) on the west side of I-5 in the Green Lake and Licton Springs neighborhoods of Seattle.

Construction crews will mainly work during the day. However, some work will be done at night if lane closures on I-5 are necessary. Residents living near the I-5 noise wall project should expect nighttime construction work on Monday, July 7 and Tuesday, July 8. This work must happen at night because it requires crews to close the off-ramp from southbound I-5 to NE 80th Street.

We will continue to keep you informed about construction activities through e-mail updates, our project Web site, and fliers for residents closest to the noise wall locations. Property owners near Wall 1 attend community meeting

Property owners closest to the proposed noise wall on the east side of I-5 ([Stage 2](#)) attended a [community meeting](#) on June 30, 2008 to discuss the preliminary noise wall design and the community poll. We answered questions and received comments from the public about the [anticipated noise benefits](#), the proposed [noise wall height and location](#), and [how noise walls work](#).

WSDOT launches neighborhood poll in Maple Leaf neighborhood

We are currently facilitating a [community poll](#) with property owners on the east side of I-5 within 500 feet of the edge of the traveled lane of I-5. The community poll is one of many sources of public input that WSDOT will consider to determine support for the proposed noise wall before continuing with design and construction. Other sources include correspondence with individual property owners, local community organizations, elected officials, and community meetings.

There will be a two-week feedback period (July 3 - 17, 2008) for submitting completed ballots. Throughout this two-week period, completed polling ballots will be tallied and summarized.
