



Join us to learn about a new SR 9 Snohomish River Bridge

The Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) is exploring options for building a new State Route 9 Bridge over the Snohomish River. Approximately 27,000 vehicles use the Snohomish River Bridge each day. That number is expected to increase with future development in the area. The current bridge, built in 1959, is insufficient to meet the growing demand.

As part of the environmental documentation study, we will choose a preferred alternative for a new Snohomish River Bridge and complete preliminary design work. We will also evaluate options for connecting a new bridge to future widening projects on SR 9. We will use the study to construct a new bridge if and when funding becomes available.
