
Washington State




I-90 Project Hidden Objects




Find these objects

6 Problems with the Highway

WSDOT will increase safety for people and wildlife on I-90 by straightening sharp curves, replacing 40 year old pavement, building wildlife crossings over and under the highway, fixing rock slopes, and reducing avalanche delays. WSDOT will reduce traffic jams by adding an extra lane in each direction. Construction began in spring of 2009.








