

# “Keeping Carson Connected” Open House

## LEARN MORE ABOUT IMPROVEMENTS TO SR 14 AND WIND RIVER ROAD



Members of the community are invited to an open house to learn about a new project that will keep people and freight connected between State Route 14 and the town of Carson in the Columbia River Gorge.

Currently, there are only two ways to access Carson from SR 14: Hot Springs Avenue, which is threatened by erosion and Wind River Road, where trucks cannot make the turn because the tight angle of the intersection.

The Washington State Department of Transportation is looking for public input on project priorities at an open house in Stevenson, Tuesday, June 7.

### Timeline

- Spring 2016: Develop alternatives, determine project priorities and gather environmental data
- Summer 2016–Fall 2017: Refine & screen alternatives, hold public open house to present the preferred design and perform geotechnical investigations
- Winter 2017–Winter 2018: Obtain environmental permits, real estate acquisitions and develop final plans, specifications and estimates
- Early 2019: Construction begins
