



# SR 520 Bridge Replacement and HOV Program



I-5 to Medina: Bridge Replacement and HOV Project

## Temporary night work on pontoon near Medina shore begins Aug. 5

***Crews to work weeknights 7 a.m. to midnight; work expected to last about 12 weeks***

WSDOT and its contractor Kiewit/General/Manson, a Joint Venture (KGM), will work extended weeknight hours near the Lake Washington shoreline in Medina from 7 p.m. to midnight starting Monday, Aug. 5. This work is expected to last about 12 weeks.

During this time, crews will build bridge support structures on Pontoon A, including pouring concrete for columns during the day and completing rebar and formwork activities at night. Pontoon A is currently moored near the SR 520 East Approach Bridge. It will later be moved to the west end of the new floating bridge where it will form the westernmost cross-pontoon. During construction, nearby residents may see temporary lighting and hear noise from concrete trucks. To limit what residents see and hear, WSDOT and KGM will use construction best practices such as limited machine idling, directing light away from residences, and performing the noisiest work during daytime hours.
