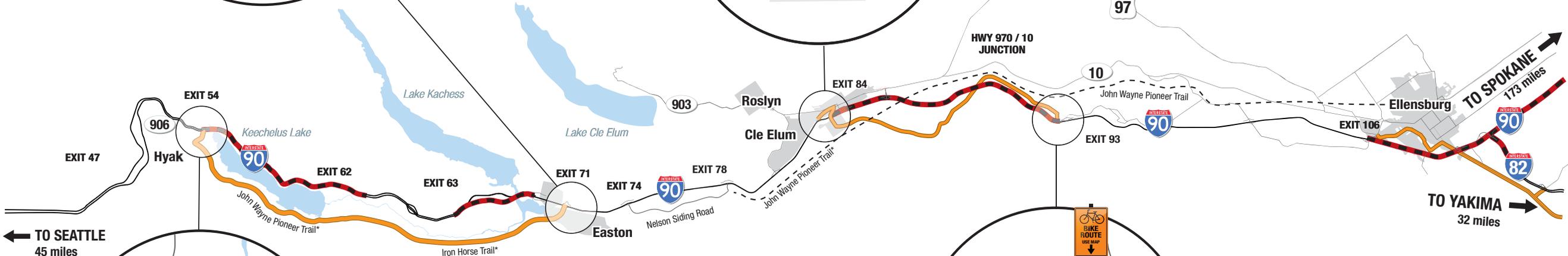
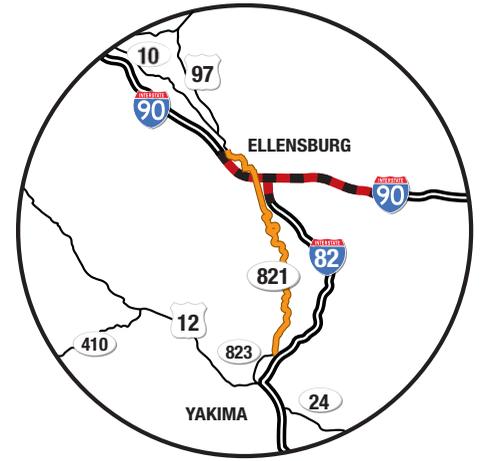
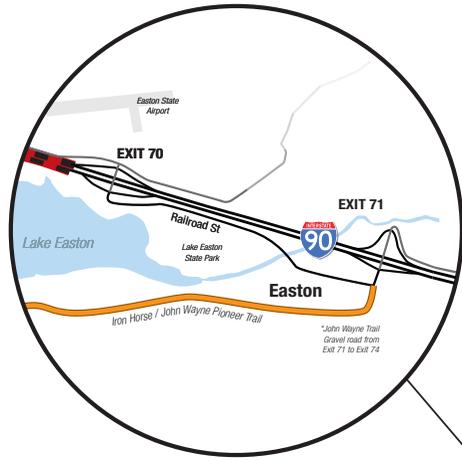


I-90 Snoqualmie Pass - Summit to Ellensburg

***Trail Condition Disclaimer:** The John Wayne Pioneer Trail and Iron Horse Trail are typically covered with snow and hard to travel by bicycle until the snow melts. These trails feature two distinct wheel paths with hard-packed earth and occasional spots of loose gravel, large cobbles or potholes. Riders with touring bikes, mountain bikes, and hybrid/commuter bikes should be able to ride the John Wayne Pioneer Trail and the Iron Horse Trail without equipment damage, assuming a tire width of at least 28 mm (~1.10"). Racing-type road bikes are not recommended due to the risk of equipment damage. The John Wayne Pioneer Trail and the Iron Horse Trail are maintained by Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission. WSDOT is not responsible for equipment damage or personal injury resulting from the use of this route.

Bike Detours:

I-90 eastbound to SR 821 southbound:

I-90 eastbound:

If you are traveling east on I-90 with a destination to SR 821/Yakima, use Exit 106.

US 97 southbound:

If you are traveling south on US 97 with a destination to SR 821/Yakima, continue onto Dolarway Rd.

University Way:

If you are traveling west on University Way with a SR 821/Yakima, turn left onto W. Dolarway Rd.

Then proceed onto Anderson Rd., turn left onto Umptanum Rd., turn right onto Canyon Rd., continue through the work zone on Canyon Rd., continue onto SR 821 to Selah.

Bicyclists can travel in the opposite direction from I-82 to I-90/US 97 interchange by using exit 3.

I-90 eastbound to I-90 eastbound:

If cyclists destination is to travel east on I-90, use Exit 106. Enter Ellensburg on University Way. Stay on University Way as it becomes Vantage Highway. Turn right at Number 81 rd., Turn left onto Main St., proceed onto Clemens Rd., and return to I-90 eastbound at Exit 115.

Bicyclists can travel in the opposite direction by exiting at Exit 115.

I-90 westbound to SR 821 southbound:

If you are traveling west on I-90 with a destination to SR 821 south, use exit 115. Turn left onto Clemens Rd., turn right onto Thrall Rd., Turn left on SR 821.

Bicyclists can travel in the opposite direction from SR 821 to I-90.
