
- What you can do to help prevent landslides on your property.

According to the recently published brochure, *How landslides affect your property*, landslides are costly to property owners and could result in:

- Lowered property value
- Increased insurance rates
- Loss of land
- Clean-up and repair of property and building structures
- Liability for damage to other properties

More than 200 landslides have occurred in the past 10 years along the Seattle to Everett coastline. Many landslides are a result of improper slope management or drainage problems. As a result, landslides along the rail line have caused more than 800 trains to be cancelled since 2009.
