



## Help us improve the safety and reliability of State Route 164 and State Route 169!

The Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) and local jurisdictions along SR 164 and SR 169 are developing Route Development Plans (RDP) that will identify short- and long-term improvements along both corridors. WSDOT held open houses in March to introduce the RDPs and gather your ideas. Since then, the team has reviewed the public's input and come up with packages of improvement projects that address safety and traffic congestion on each corridor. WSDOT would like to hear from you before the RDPs are finalized.
