VISION

All transportation partners in Washington state will work together to provide a system of diverse and integrated public transportation options. People throughout the state will use these options to make transportation choices that enable their families, communities, economy and environment to thrive.

Washington's seven million residents and half million businesses are changing the ways we communicate, connect, travel and transact. In addition to a projected population growth of more than 25 percent during the next 20 years, public transportation must adapt to trends like aging Baby Boomers, the suburbanization of poverty, transportation technology, urbanization and more. The Washington State Public Transportation Plan offers a blueprint to further integrate all modes of transportation to meet Washington's public transportation needs over the next 20 years. It affirms the state's role in public transportation, emphasizing performance, partnerships and WSDOT's practical solutions approach. It was developed in close coordination with agencies, non-profits and communities throughout Washington State, who will play key roles in implementing the plan.



Long-Term Plan, Near-Term Actions

This plan sets forth five goals for Washington's system of public transportation: thriving communities, access, adaptive transportation capacity, customer experience and transportation system guardianship. The plan lists strategies and a program of near-term actions for each goal to be complete by December 2017.
