## 92nd Avenue Northeast on-ramp to eastbound SR 520 closes for safety and transit improvements

Monday, May 13, to the morning of Tuesday, May 14 crews will perform essential safety and transit improvements. Crews will install a flashing cross-walk device across 92nd Avenue Northeast to improve pedestrian safety, and relocate the eastbound bus stop platform along the highway. This work needs to be performed at night to keep traffic moving throughout the day.

### Here are the important work details:

- **Date:** Monday, May 13, to the morning of Tuesday, May 14
- **Lane closure:** 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. crews will flag traffic at the 92nd Avenue Northeast over SR 520.
- **Ramp closure:** 2 a.m. to 5 a.m. crews will close the on-ramp to eastbound SR 520.
- **Nighttime noise:** Residents may hear construction machinery and drilling along 92nd Avenue Northeast and SR 520, beginning as early as 8 p.m. on Monday, May 13.
