


What's happening on US 2 near Index?



When a semi crashed near the Anderson Creek Bridge in Dec. 2009, the concrete panel it was carrying slid onto the bridge rail and damaged it.

On Dec. 27, 2009, a 56,000-pound concrete panel crashed onto the railing of the Anderson Creek Bridge after the semi hauling it crashed. WSDOT crews removed the panel on Dec. 30 and completed emergency repairs by Jan. 7, 2010.

This spring, crews will replace the temporarily repaired bridge railing with a new railing that meets current federal standards. Crews will also grind down and repave the bridge deck to extend its useful life for the more than 5,900 drivers who use the bridge daily.



What is the project timeline?

We will begin construction April 2 and will complete work by April 27.

What can drivers expect?

Drivers can expect an around-the-clock single lane continuous closure for up to 19 days as crews work to repair the damaged rail. The closure is set for April 9 to 27.
