RE: Section 601 – Fund Transfers (Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 6001)

Dear Mr. Schumacher:

Section 601 of Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill (ESSB) 6001 authorizes the Director of Financial Management to approve allocation adjustments for highway projects funded with Transportation 2003 Account (Nickel) and/or Transportation Partnership Account (TPA) appropriations.

Additionally, section 306 (13) requires the department to continue to work with the City of Seattle on the “westside” component of the bridge replacement project which is currently unfunded. The department estimates that it will require \$10 million to accomplish the scope of work put forth in the provision and no additional funding was provided in the budget. This letter identifies the source of those funds as the TPA savings.

Furthermore, section 602 of ESSB 6001 authorizes the department to enter into a new agreement with King County for the purpose of public transportation mitigation for the SR 99/Alaskan Way Viaduct – Replacement project through the end of the 2013-15 fiscal biennium. The department estimates the cost of continued mitigation at \$9 million through the end of the biennium. The legislative transportation committees must be notified of the source and amount of the funds prior to any expenditure. This letter identifies the source of those funds as TPA savings.

Consistent with the process established by the Office of Financial Management, the department is submitting the necessary documentation for review and approval of these requests. The following proposed adjustments address cash flow issues that would otherwise prevent the delivery of these projects.

In summary, the department requests OFM's approval to transfer \$21,480,000 of Transportation Partnership Account appropriation to the listed projects that require additional appropriation authority in the current biennium. The department has identified a list of projects to offset the additional Transportation Partnership Account appropriation needed for this increase.


Provide \$9,000,000 of additional TPA funds in 2013-15.
