BASED ON the language of WAC 468-51-010, the CITY did NOT think that A SEPERATE ORDINANCE NEEDED to be PASSED. The CITY several years ago adopted in the fee resolution the fees identified in 468-51-070. The city has been following WAC 468-52 and is nearly complete in having a access control median on SR 516 ^{with in} ~~along~~ the entire city limits. IF A SEPERATE ~~NOT~~ ordinance NEEDS to be adopted we will include it in the 2008 WORKPLAN.

ORDINANCE NO. 23-08

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COVINGTON, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON, PROVIDING FOR ACCESS MANAGEMENT, ACCESS PERMITS, AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROCESS PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 47.50 RCW.

WHEREAS, Chapter 47.50 of the Revised Code of Washington ("RCW") requires cities to adopt standards for access permitting on streets designated as state highways which meet or exceed the Washington State Department of Transportation's ("WSDOT") standards, provided that such standards may not be inconsistent with standards adopted by the department; and

WHEREAS, WSDOT's standards are contained in Chapters 468-51 and 468-52 of the Washington Administrative Code ("WAC"); and

WHEREAS, the City of Covington has been using the WSDOT standards found in Chapters 468-51 and 468-52 WAC for the managed access state highway within its boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the Covington City Council finds it is necessary to provide regulation and control of vehicular access and connection points of ingress to, and egress from, the state highway system within the incorporated areas of the City of Covington;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COVINGTON, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:


Section 1. Pursuant to the requirements and authority of Chapter 47.50 RCW, there is hereby adopted by reference the provisions of Chapters 468-51 and 468-52 WAC, together with all future amendments, in order to implement the requirements of Chapter 47.50 RCW.

Section 2. For purposes of this Ordinance and of the regulations adopted by reference, the term "government entity" means the City of Covington. Where there is any reference to "the department" in the administrative and procedural sections adopted by reference, that reference shall be deemed to mean the City of Covington for purposes of this Ordinance. All fees due and payable in connection access permitting shall be paid to the City of Covington.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect five (5) days after proper posting and publication. A summary of this Ordinance may be published in lieu of publishing the ordinance in its entirety.

Section 4. If any provision of this ordinance, or ordinance modified by it is determined to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the remaining provision of this ordinance and ordinances and/or resolutions modified by it shall remain in force and effect.




