SR 99 Spokane St. overpass (timber bridge) replacement

This 470-foot section of SR 99 just south of the West Seattle Bridge is a key freight and commute corridor. More than 45,000 trucks and vehicles cross the bridge everyday to access the Port of Seattle and downtown Seattle.

The bridge was built in 1959 as a temporary structure. In 2013, crews will replace the 55-year old timber supports with a permanent structure made with lightweight blocks of Styrofoam-type material capped with concrete. New high-efficiency lighting is also part of the work.

These 55-year-old timber supports are splitting.

Construction timeline and traffic impact

February 2013 – June 2014

- One of two southbound lanes closed around the clock.
- Two northbound lanes remain open.

June 2014

- Construction is complete.
