

New parking spaces for park users coming to East Park Drive East

April 2015

As soon as Monday, May 4, crews will begin installing eight back-in angle parking spaces on the east side of East Park Drive East, including an ADA-compliant parking space. Crews will work for approximately three weeks during the day to complete the first installation of work in this area. Four additional parking spaces will be added and final roadway paving will occur in late 2017 when crews construct stormwater treatment improvements and landscaping at the former Museum of History and Industry (MOHAI) area.

Construction activities


- Use of heavy equipment like excavators to remove the planter strip and shrubs between East Park Drive East and 24th Avenue East to allow room for the work and new spaces.
- Use of heavy equipment like saw cutters, trucks, compactors and paving machines to remove pavement, repave and stripe the new parking spaces.

Temporary street closure


- East Park Drive East will remain open during the majority of work.
- Paving activities will require a street closure of East Park Drive East for one day between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Detour signage will be posted in advance for vehicles, bicyclists and pedestrians to use alleyway access between East Shelby Street and East Hamlin Street.
- Existing on-street parking will remain open.

Construction hours

- To limit disruption to the neighborhood, crews plan to construct these new parking spaces during the daytime on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.
