## SR 520 westbound transit stop at 92nd Avenue Northeast adjusts on June 3

*Pedestrian path to be realigned with the new westbound highway lanes following full weekend closure*

Following the May 31-June 3 weekend closure of SR 520, corridor neighbors can expect a slight realignment of the pedestrian path to the westbound SR 520 transit stop at 92nd Avenue Northeast. During the weekend closure, crews will realign the westbound SR 520 lanes to the south, requiring the realignment of the pedestrian path to the transit station. The new path will include signage and users can expect a more direct path compared to the previous configuration.

### Here are the details:

- **Date:** Beginning Monday, June 3, until the new westbound SR 520 lanes are complete later this fall.
- **Location:** SR 520 westbound transit stop at 92nd Avenue Northeast
