Corridor Vision

SR 202 is a highway corridor that accommodates safe and efficient movement of people and goods.

Project Goals

The Project Team will develop recommendations that are endorsed by the study's Corridor Working Group (CWG) partners. These recommendations will address existing and future deficiencies in a manner that is cost effective, acceptable to communities along the corridor, sensitive to environmental conditions, responsive to the vision above, and addresses the following areas:

Safety - Reduce the severity and frequency of collisions and injuries by proposing improvements that will address existing High Accident Locations (HAL), High Accident Corridor (HAC), and design deficiencies related to safety.

Mobility - Enhance the performance of the corridor through transportation investments and operational strategies ranging from basic maintenance to advanced technologies. Develop access options that encourage optimal spacing of intersections and signals, and that meet the guidelines for the defined access class of the roadway. Mobility improvements should benefit existing and future operations for all transportation users, including transit users, pedestrians, and bicyclists.

Preservation – Preserve the current transportation system to extend the life of the existing facility. Consider options to replace or do major rehabilitation when the replacement cost would be offset by the present value of reduced maintenance costs.

Public Involvement - Keep the public informed on the progress of the study and solicit input by holding an open house, attending various local events, installing a traveling display at local public institutions such as libraries, and maintaining the project web site.

Project Outcomes

This corridor study will be considered a success if:

- The public and CWG partners are meaningfully involved in the development of recommendations.
- CWG partners endorse the final corridor study and its recommendations.
- There is a clear phasing plan for implementation.
- The CWG partners work together to solidify funding for the study's recommendations.
