92nd Avenue Northeast lid construction requires SR 520 lane closures

Three weeks of night work begins Sept. 4; helps reduce total construction time

Eastside Corridor Constructors crews must close a single SR 520 mainline lanes to complete the next phase of 92nd Avenue Northeast lid construction – a move that can only be done at night or on weekends. Working at night will reduce overall construction time and will keep this critical work on schedule.

While work will continue during the daytime hours, beginning Sept. 4, overnight work will take place between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m., Monday through Friday, for up to three weeks.

Overnight crews will pour concrete that forms the center pier wall for the 92nd Avenue Northeast lid. Construction activities near the highway require that we close a lane to keep drivers and workers safe. Highway lane closures are limited to nights and weekends to keep traffic moving during weekdays. Lid girders are scheduled to be set during a full weekend closure later this fall.

Nighttime construction noise expected: Residents near SR 520 can expect to hear the sounds of power tools, trucks, heavy construction vehicles, back-up alarms and light generators.
