

WSDOT Fish Passage Program - Informational Meeting for Contractors

The Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) is required to replace several hundred culverts under state highways in Northwest Washington in the next 15 years. These culverts have been determined to be barriers to fish, which must be able to move freely up and down waterways in order to grow to adults and spawn. In order to provide the right conditions for the fish, culverts must be replaced with bridges or much larger culverts.

At the current time, WSDOT does not have the funding to complete this program. Due to a substantial number of inquiries, we are holding an informational meeting for contractors to outline the basics of the program. We are also interested in informal discussion of your ideas for efficient completion of the program. All interested parties are invited to attend.

Please note that this is an informational meeting only. Attendance at the meeting is not required for bidding on or participating in future construction projects. Notice of advertisement of these projects will be via normal WSDOT channels.
