

Seattle/Bainbridge Island and Seattle/Bremerton

Temporary weekend schedule Saturday Oct. 20 and Sunday Oct. 21

Because of major construction activities on Colman Dock, all Bremerton and Bainbridge Island sailings will share a single slip on Saturday, Oct. 20 and Sunday, Oct. 21. In order to prevent more than one ferry from arriving or departing the single slip at the same time, vessels will operate slower, and departure times will shift between 5 and 30 minutes on most sailings. We'll resume the existing sailing schedule and reopen both slips beginning Monday, Oct. 22. Thank you for your patience.

What can customers do to prepare for Oct. 20-21 changes?

- **Plan ahead:** Departure times will be different on Oct. 20 and Oct. 21. Check the schedule in advance.
- **Arrive early in Seattle:** If you are departing from Colman Dock plan to arrive at least 30 minutes before your sailing.
- **Add extra travel time:** Crossing times will be longer when the single slip is occupied.

Colman Dock Project: Construction update

Slips 1 and 3 closed for construction activities Oct. 20-21



Major construction starts on north side of Colman Dock

Crews will start demolishing part of the dock north of the terminal building on Oct. 18. On Saturday, Oct. 20, Slip 3 will be closed so the Pacific Lifter, a giant barge with a floating crane, can move into place. Crews will construct a platform on the north side of the dock for another large crane that will be used for upcoming construction. Customers can expect loud pile-driving work during daylight hours only. Quieter construction activities may occur overnight.

What's happening at Colman Dock?

- We are replacing the aging terminal and the seismically vulnerable parts of Colman Dock in Seattle in order to maintain its critical role as a regional multimodal transportation hub.
- Colman Dock remains open and operational while the dock is under construction.
- Vehicle holding space on the dock will shrink as the work zone expands; overflow vehicles will be directed to wait at Pier 48.
