SR 9: 32nd Street S.E. closed weekend of Sept 20th

What is WSDOT doing?

Contractor crews working for the Washington State Department of Transportation will close 32nd Street S.E. on the west side of SR 9 from 9 p.m. Friday, Sept. 19 to 5 a.m. Monday, Sept. 22. Drivers will follow a short detour to reach SR 9, which will remain open in both directions.

During the closure, the crews will rebuild 32nd Street S.E. between SR 9 and 95th Drive S.E. in preparation for installing a new traffic signal. Currently, 32nd Street S.E. is quite steep. Crews will reduce the angle of the road and install wider shoulders to provide drivers with better sight distance and a more level area at the new signal.

Will it be noisy?

Crews will work around-the-clock to complete the road rebuilding work with a single weekend closure. As a result, nearby residents may hear noise. To reduce the impact, the crews will:

- use approved bed liners in trucks
- use ambient back-up signals on vehicles
- have earplugs available in advance
