

Get a view of tunneling history in the making



In summer 2013, the **world's largest-diameter tunnel boring machine** will begin a two-mile journey beneath downtown Seattle. Its purpose: dig a tunnel to replace the SR 99 Alaskan Way Viaduct.

You can now take a self-guided tour of this massive project's work zone. Walk or bike along the paved path west of the construction area, near the stadiums. Watch as crews dig the launch pit for the 300-foot-long boring machine. Displays along the path describe construction activities, machinery at work and the area's history.
