


Program Description

The SR 520 Corridor Program will replace the Portage Bay and Evergreen Point bridges and improve existing roadway between I-5 in Seattle and SR 202 on the Eastside.


The SR 520 Corridor Program includes four projects:

- **Urban Partnership** – congestion management tolling from I-5 to I-405.
- **Eastside Transit and HOV** – Evergreen Point Road to SR 202.
- **Pontoon Construction Project** – pontoons for catastrophic failure planning.
- **Bridge Replacement and HOV Project** – I-5 to just east of Evergreen Point Road.

Upcoming Key Milestones*

2008

- WSDOT completes a report on accelerated Eastside improvements to improve transit operations.
- Puget Sound Clean Air Agency and Public Health – Seattle and King County complete the project's health impact assessment.
- WSDOT, King County Metro, Sound Transit, and University of Washington complete the project's high capacity transit plan.
- WSDOT updates the project's finance plan.
- Project impact plan submitted to the legislature and governor.



2009

- The Tolling Implementation Committee submits their report on tolling SR 520 to the governor and legislature.
- WSDOT publishes the environmental assessment for the Eastside transit and HOV improvements.
- WSDOT completes the environmental review process for the SR 520 Pontoon Construction Project.
- WSDOT publishes the supplemental draft environmental impact statement for bridge replacement.
- WSDOT publishes the environmental assessment for the Urban Partnership tolling project.
- Washington State Legislature considers tolling authorization.
