Who is the 520 Tolling Implementation Committee?

Tolls on 520 will help pay for a new bridge. A tolling implementation committee was named by the Washington State Legislature in March 2008 to explore how tolls can work for people who use 520, nearby communities and taxpayers.

The committee is comprised of:

The committee is charged with:

- Evaluating potential diversion from 520 to other parts of the transportation system.
- Evaluating advanced tolling technology.
- Evaluating new applications of emerging technology to better manage traffic.
- Exploring opportunities to partner with the business community to reduce congestion and contribute to the project.
- Conferring with mayors and city councils.
- Conducting public open houses.
- Providing a report to the governor and legislature in January 2009.

Your opinion will help shape how tolling is implemented in the 520 corridor. The committee will be hosting a series of public outreach events and input opportunities related to tolling in the 520 corridor during summer 2008. This public input will be included in a report to the state legislature in January 2009, setting the stage for legislative decisions.
