

WSDOT is awarding approximately \$30 million in public transportation grants from the new revenue transportation package called Connecting Washington.

WSDOT awarded grants to 30 public transportation providers in 25 counties to date. The 43 projects include capital investments, such as park-and-ride facilities, bus-stop shelters and bike-share expansion, as well as purchases of new and replacement buses, mini-buses and vanpool vans. Through four public transportation grant programs identified in Connecting Washington, these grants will support critical transportation needs for commuters, people with special needs, rural residents, and seniors in communities throughout Washington.*
