Draft EIS Comment Guide

Public Comment Period: May 2, 2008 to July 1, 2008

The Columbia River Crossing (CRC) Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) describes potential effects on the surrounding neighborhoods and environment, flow of local and highway traffic, improvements to transit, bicycling and walking and options for project financing.

The Draft EIS and public comment period are required by the federal government to ensure that people affected by the project have an opportunity to learn about and comment on the proposal before a decision is made. Your comments will be considered and responded to in preparing the Final EIS.

Why comment?

- To ensure the alternatives and effects analyzed are complete and accurate
- To help select an alternative that solves transportation problems and meets the community's needs
- To inform local decision-makers on public opinion
- To shape the *Locally Preferred Alternative* and measures taken to minimize impacts

The *Locally Preferred Alternative* is the alternative selected by local decision-makers as the preferred solution to the project's identified needs. This selection will focus on three choices: a bridge type (replacement or supplemental), transit mode (bus rapid transit or light rail) and a transit alignment.

Comment Period

The CRC Draft EIS public comment period extends until July 1, 2008. Comments are accepted at any time during the comment period. Public hearings focused on hearing public feedback will be held:

Examples of Draft EIS Comments

Example #1

► Tell who you are/why you are interested

I am a supporter of the Historic Reserve. In the Draft EIS, I notice interchange design options for SR 14.

Given the likely impacts to the Reserve, I prefer an interchange design which could leave land to replace land lost to the expansion of the freeway.

➤ Identify project details that you like and/or dislike

Example #2

Suggest ways to address your concern

I am a resident of the Blaney Park neighborhood. <u>I support transit</u> that connects to other systems easily.

I am interested in station comfort. <u>I would like to see</u> <u>design amenities included which protect riders from the elements</u>.

I think pedestrian and bicycle amenities at stations are very important. In particular, enough bicycle parking in good visible locations should be provided.

Provide opinions or preferences on specific impacts and, where possible, use examples or data

How will my comment be processed?


Comments received during the public comment period will be considered and responded to in the Final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). Similar comments may be grouped and summarized when included in the Final EIS. The Final EIS is expected to be published in 2009.

To provide feedback to local decision-makers, comments will be summarized during the public comment period into a report for local decision-makers to consider in endorsing an alternative as the Locally Preferred Alternative. The local decision-makers are:

- Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT)
- Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT)
- Southwest Washington Regional Transportation Council (RTC)
- Metro
- C-TRAN
- TriMet
- · City of Vancouver
- · City of Portland

How will I know that my comment was received?
