




## Governor's "Safe Start" approach to reopening

The governor recently released ["Safe Start" plans and guidance for reopening](#). The county-by-county approach means different parts of our system may be in different phases at any given time. Generally, [our ridership numbers](#) have been hovering around 50-60% below this same time last year.

The governor also unveiled a [Safe Start Guide to reopening state agencies](#) this week. This document will help us develop and implement the best plan for our worksites, which of course include our vessels and terminals.

### Vehicle reservations for summer available tomorrow, June 12

With our [current reduced schedules extended](#) until further notice, we can now release vehicle reservations for the summer. Customers can [go online and save a spot](#) for June 21 through Sept. 26 on our Anacortes/San Juan Islands and Port Townsend/Coupeville routes starting at 7 a.m. tomorrow, June 12.

The first 30% of space on all summer sailings will be released, along with the second third for all sailings through June 26. The second tier of reservations opens two weeks before

the panels of the south-facing roof will generate energy for the building's operations, with extra energy sold to the power grid. ### **Minor delays for sailings arriving at Colman Dock next week, June 15-19**

Riders catching a ferry at our Bainbridge or Bremerton terminals should prepare for minor delays into Seattle next week, June 15-19.

Construction work to [rebuild Colman Dock](#) will affect two sailings each day:

- 2:05 p.m. Bainbridge departure will be at 2:15 p.m. and arrive in Seattle about 15 minutes late
- 9 p.m. Bremerton departure will be at 9:05 p.m. and arrive in Seattle about 10 minutes late
